Father's Corner

"If you do not renounce your possessions you cannot be my disciple."

This Sunday's Gospel tells us that following Jesus demands renunciation. If we take the trouble to study the lives of the Saints, we will find that their lives were woven of very little things and that it is their faithfulness and their constancy which have been of value in the eyes of the Lord.

Moreover, the Lord tells us: "He who is faithful in small things will be faithful in great things" (Luke 16:10). We see that the Lord's ways of measuring are very different from ours. For instance, there are children who are saints. We can assume that they did not have to perform extraordinary actions... The smallest things have an important dimension in the eyes of God.

So in the end, it is the love with which we clothe our smallest actions that makes them valuable in the eyes of the Lord. Giving a glass of water out of love is greater than performing the most heroic deed with indifference or just to show off.

A Christian is essentially a person who has understood that Jesus asks him to prefer him to everything. Are we able to see what material goods could weigh down, and get rid of it?.. When a ship is in the grip of a storm, it is a saving move to throw its overflow into the sea... And again the bird that wants to climb into the sky, even a silken thread attached to its foot could be an obstacle.
