# **Father's Corner**

#### God or mammon?

In the Gospel of this Sunday, Jesus tells us that we are stewards of the Kingdom of God. Not only will the Lord ask us for an accurate account of how we have administered our personal life, but He will ask us what we have done for those who live near us. Because we are baptized and have received gifts that others have not received, we have become responsible for bringing many into the Kingdom of Heaven. The Lord has entrusted us with the mission of bringing many others to him. We are a bit like the Face of the Kingdom here on earth and we can give (or not) many people here and now, the foretaste of Jesus Christ and his Kingdom. What face of God do we present to our children? To those with whom we do business? We cannot save ourselves alone, it is in a cluster that we will enter the Kingdom.

And again, this is why we must hoard for eternal life. When we leave the earth we bring no amount of the money we have accumulated here below, except the money which interested God, the money we have shared with Love, and even gave madly to others in need. The people we have helped will be there to tell the Most High what we have done; we'll be clothed and shielded by our generosity; we'll have as friends many who will welcome us joyfully; we'll not be strangers to God-Love since we ourselves were Love on on earth. Transforming our money into Love, what an investment!

However, even embellished by this Parable of Jesus, this lesson remains very difficult to assimilate. It is the call to sharing but one quickly finds reasons to refuse to hear it...
