Works of mercy, the path to Life.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear of a rich man who lives in luxury and a poor man living in total destitution, right outside his door...

This Gospel is seen today in our world where some peoples are overwhelmed with wealth while others are disadvantaged and miserable. Worse, the rich continue to grow their bank accounts while the poor are constantly getting poorer. And often, alas!, these rich people do not even notice the misery that surrounds them.

It is a fact that riches often cause God to be forgotten. This rich man of whom the Gospel speaks felt independent, self-sufficient and not finding time to consult the Word of God, the Law or the Prophets. When Abraham reminds him that all he had to do to gain eternal reward in heaven was written in the Word, the Law and the Prophets, he realizes that he did not care when he was on earth. However, he remembers his family, he still has five brothers, he says. Couldn't we warn them? No, Abraham replies that if they listen to the natural Law inscribed in their hearts they will know that before God, there is no class of people and that all humans are sons of God, therefore brothers.


