Father's Corner

"Although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned, you have revealed them to little ones."

It is said that "knowledge is power." Knowledge is power because it enables us to make better decisions, improve our lives, pursue more options, be more creative, grasp more fully the meaning of life. Coming to Jesus to know the Father grants us the greatest of all power.

Even though coming to know the Father through Jesus gives us the greatest power, we should be mindful that this power does not come easy. We must tie ourselves to Jesus, learn from him, and shape our lives according to his meekness and humility of heart. To tie ourselves to Jesus means that we empty ourselves of ourselves. Ultimately the greatest power is letting go of ourselves and grasping Jesus.

How can Jesus claim the yoke he places upon us is easy and the burden he gives us is light? Our experience of faithful discipleship does not bear this out. Rather, the labor is hard, demanding, endless, intensive, and many times even discouraging. So why would we take his yoke upon ourselves and learn from Jesus? Because knowledge is power. Knowledge is learning that letting go of ourselves and tying ourselves to Jesus is the only way to the Father the only Power we really need.

What special prayers does the priest pray over the elements on the altar? Do we join him?

The priest prays over the elements of bread and wine to be used during the consecration. He prepares the chalice with wine mixed with a little water. This symbolizes both the union of the divine and human in Jesus, and also the union of our lives and sacrifices with the sacrifice of Jesus.

Twice the congregation responds: "Blessed be God forever." The priest then washes his hands as an expression of his desire to be spiritually cleansed and made worthy to consecrate the Mass.

Then the people pray: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church."
