

FATHER'S COLUMN

Jesus said to them,

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you."

Changing one's mind, especially when done often, carries negative connotations of being inconstant, irresolute, uncommitted, indecisive, unreliable. Yet often, situations, behaviors, and intentions actually request a change of mind; for example, when we are clearly wrong about something, or we are misinformed, or we need to change the course of our life so growth can happen. These are examples of the kind of change of mind Jesus calls forth from us.

Following Jesus faithfully requires that our 'yes' to God and each other be honest, our 'no' to what we should not do be firm; our conversion of heart be ongoing and expandable.

Like the first son, like the tax collectors and prostitutes, we must be willing to evaluate our choices and behaviors and bring them in line with what the Lord asks of us. Changing one's mind, choosing conversion of self, is a matter of complete honesty with self, God, and others.

But then, how can we be honest with ourselves, with God, and with others?

Sometimes others show us the way when they challenge our behaviors, principles, attitudes, words. Sometimes prayer opens us to God's will and the kind of self-examination that will lead us to say "yes" to God. Sometimes when we are like the second son and the chief priests and elders and don't intend to

be honest or obedient, the negative consequences of our choices weigh upon us and bring us to a change of mind and heart. Conversion of self is a lifelong process of growth and openness to what God asks of us.

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST REFLECTIONS

What kind of posture is proper during the Our Father?

Some local communities and individuals have the informal practice of holding hands during the Our Father, or of people extending their hands in imitation of the gesture prescribed for the priest during the prayer. The gesture proper to the faithful during the prayer is called the "orans," that is, the hands joined together in the traditional posture of prayer or with arms extended toward God like the priest.

Baby Bottle Fundraiser



LOVING ARMS PREGNANCY CENTER MINISTRY INFORMATION



History

The seeds of a crisis pregnancy center that would reach out to young women with God's love and provide help with alternatives to abortion were planted when Carol Heberling shared her vision of a crisis pregnancy center in Taylorville at her church's visioning session. She had heard about ministries like it on a Focus on the Family radio program. Sharing the concern eventually led to pastors and members of area churches coming together in the form of a steering committee which ultimately led to the opening of Loving Arms Crisis Pregnancy Center on Mother's Day in May of 1999.

Mission

To affirm the value of life by providing alternatives through Christ-centered care to those who are at risk or hurt by abortion within Christian County and surrounding areas.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Intervention Programs

Pregnancy Services include pregnancy tests, options counseling, referrals for ultrasound, community and medical referrals and related issues. As part of our options counseling, we also provide resources and referrals for those facing difficult decisions following a life-limiting prenatal diagnosis for their baby. Those resources and referrals include bereavement photography after they baby is born...pictures of them with their baby that they can cherish. This provides them with hope and aids in the grief process (although there is no timeline for grief). It also allows them to love their baby into the arms of Jesus.

Earn While You Learn provides education and resources for parenting and healthy decision making as well as an opportunity to earn material items for baby needs.

Men of Honor connects fathers with mentors who offer support and guidance unique to men.

Prevention Programs

Choices4Life™ is a sexual risk avoidance program helping teens develop life skills needed for a positive future and a healthy marriage later in life.

Woman 360° is a relationship-coaching program empowering women to respect, value, and protect their bodies.

Thrive is a program that helps her recognize and step out of unhealthy cycles to transform her life.

Recovery Programs

Healing the Heart is a confidential faith-based healing and support class for those struggling with the pain of a past abortion.

Love You Forever is an 11-week faith-based study ministering to women who have experienced a pregnancy loss through miscarriage, stillbirth or early infant death.
