

FATHER'S COLUMN

"It is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations.

You are witnesses of these things."

Jesus, the risen One, walks among us in "flesh and bone": he is our family and our friends who offer their love to us and receive the love we give them; he is the poor and troubled person who challenges us to imitate his compassion and servanthood.

As the risen Jesus appears to the eleven disciples as "flesh and bone," Jesus calls us to be "flesh and bone" witnesses of his resurrection, to be "flesh and bone" compassion and justice to all. In calling us to be "witnesses" of his resurrection, Jesus asks us to live his Gospel of peace and reconciliation in the simplicity of our everyday lives, in the complexities of our workplaces, in the struggle to realize our hopes and dreams for ourselves and our families.

Just as the risen Jesus asks the eleven disciples if they have "anything here to eat," he seeks the same from us today in the cries and pleas of the poor and the needy in our midst. In imitating his humility and compassion, we in turn "feed" our own hunger for fulfillment, for purpose, for God.

To become witnesses of Christ's resurrection is to embrace his peace in our own lives, and work joyfully to bring that peace into the lives of others. both for them and for ourselves.

Easter is a second Creation, a second Beginning for all of us. In the risen Christ, God has recreated the world, God has restarted life, including our own, so we may live in the compassion, justice, and peace of the Gospel. Easter faith transforms our vision to realize God's hand in every moment, transforms our attitudes to realize the need for God's compassion and forgiveness in every human encounter, transforms our spirits to realize that there is always reason to hope, even in the face of life's most painful and traumatic moments. The Gospel of the risen One is a light in which we see God's love as the force that animates our existence, and the love that unites all of us as sons and daughters of God.


