FATHER'S COLUMN

Then Jesus approached and said to them,
"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to
me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the
Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Being born into a family is a birthright. Growing in
relationship with family members, accepting their values
and their growing edges, and sacrificing for their good is
a constant choice. And while a birth family can be
rejected, the reality of being born into a given family
cannot be changed. Likewise, Baptism is our birth into
the Holy Trinity and the family of the Church. It is our
choice to accept or reject this baptismal birthright.

Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in the
name of the Trinity. Belonging to the Trinity is our
baptismal birthright. It is God's unparalleled gift to us to
be invited into the intimate, relational life of Father, Son,
and Holy Spirit. It is our choice to accept or reject this
gift.

We accept our baptismal family when we, for
example, gather with other members of the church for
liturgy, share ourselves and our goods with those less
fortunate than us, forgive those who hurt us, help others
grow in their love of God. We reject our baptismal family
when we turn against another, destroy another's
reputation with idle gossip, do not take time for prayer,
put ourselves first. God gives us all the help we need to
choose to live our baptismal birthright in the intimate Life
of the Most Holy Trinity. Do we choose it?
