

## **FATHER'S COLUMN**

Jesus said to them in reply,
"Who are my mother and my brothers?"
And looking around at those seated in the circle he said,
"Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does
the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

In the humanity we all share, we are bound to one another in a way that not only goes past the things that usually divide us, but can become even stronger when we face loss and suffering. Jesus comes as the means of unity among God's people, to reconcile humanity to God and to one another, to instill a deeper appreciation of our sacred dignity as being made in God's image.

Jesus destroys the evil barriers created by race, culture, wealth, and social status in order to realize the Father's vision of one Human family.

We are called, as the Church of the new Covenant, to seek and work for the humanity we all share, that comes from God, the Father of all and the Giver of everything that is good.

Sometimes we act out of a self-centeredness that is of "Satan," and not out of the compassionate spirit of Jesus, and, for sure, the "house" we build out of such selfishness collapses in anger and hurt. Therefore, if a house is to stand, it must be constructed out of forgiveness, humility, and generosity; to build it of cheaper materials, to compromise the integrity of the structure by placing one's own interest over that of the family, is to invite disaster.

Jesus' life is testimony to the reality that the "power" of "Beelzebub" cannot heal or restore or recreate. Only the Spirit of God can bring about such transformation.

Jesus was considered "insane" by many of his hearers. This strange rabbi from Nazareth appears with the crazy idea that love will triumph over hatred, that light will shatter the darkness, that life will conquer death. This "crazy" Jesus seeks to heal us of what is, in fact, our own "insanity": the "insanity" of allowing narrow-mindedness, pride, anger, prejudice, and self-centeredness to estrange us from one another; the madness of constantly grabbing as much as we can and as fast as we can, while many people on this planet have nothing. Jesus invites us to become "alive" in his "insane, mad" sense of community, joy, and reconciliation.
