

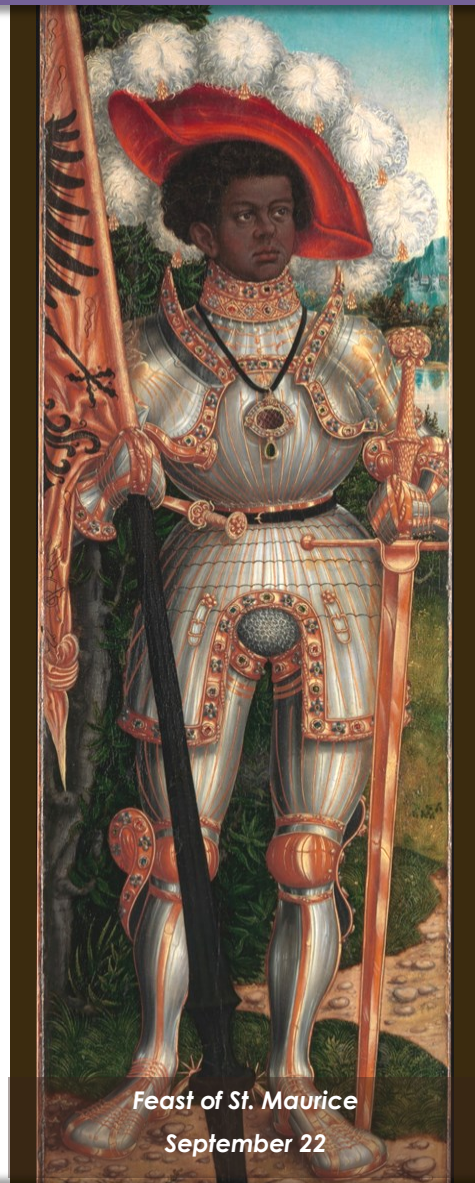

FATHER'S COLUMN

Then Jesus straightened up and said to her,
"Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned
you?" She replied, "No one, sir."

Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you.
Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

The Gospel of this fifth Sunday of Lent challenges us on a number of levels, as it always seems easier to point out someone else's sins rather than recognizing our own need for conversion. What is it about human nature that makes this so?

Human beings like to reassure themselves that they are good and the others, are bad, just like one does when he wants to get into a fight. This way, it is so easy to create "the other", the one who is not like us, the outsider, in order to destroy him.

So many of the difficult situations we encounter stem from creating a sense of otherness. We do this in the workplace, in schools, and even in church. But Isaiah speaks to the promise that Jesus brings to fulfillment: "Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new!" Rather than focusing on what separates us from others or increasing the chasm of difference, Jesus offers another way. Jesus points to forgiveness and reconciliation.

The Gospel of this Sunday foreshadows what we will experience very soon in Holy Week. Just as Jesus transforms the situation with the woman from violence to forgiveness, he himself will show the life that springs from death. Jesus did not condemn but forgives, loves, and welcomes. He tells the woman and each of us, "Go, and from now on do not sin any more!" As we advance toward the end of this Lenten season, are we willing to extend the forgiveness Jesus offers to others? Perhaps more importantly, are we willing to accept Jesus' forgiveness ourselves?
