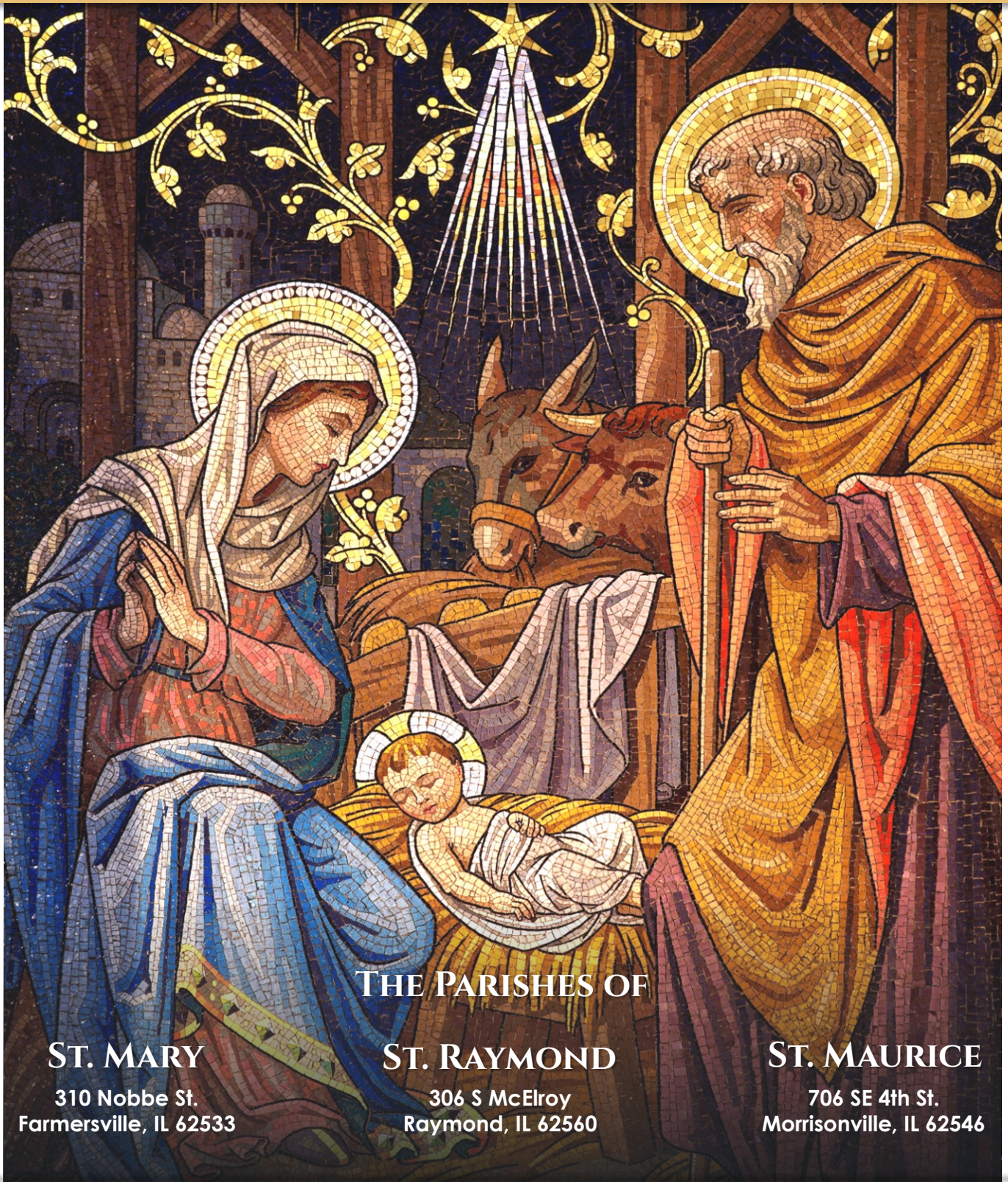

FATHER'S COLUMN

When the magi had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said,
"Rise, take the child and his mother,
flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you.
Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him."
Joseph rose and took the child and his mother
by night and departed for Egypt.

Parents of small children know the difficulties a long trip can pose. They are hardly in the car and the little ones are either hungry or need to use a restroom. Games, toys, and even tablets seem to keep them occupied only for a short time. Parents pray that they will fall asleep! Even sometimes they plan their trips around nap time, which give them some peace and quiet time. Parents, especially might be able to relate to the Gospel of this Sunday.

Joseph is a Christmas man! Only instead of celebrating, he dreams of what he needs to do to protect his foster Son (and, no doubt, imagines the hardships he must endure). The angel commands Joseph, "rise, take.... flee." This is no easy thing, especially because Joseph is to take his family to Egypt: the very country the Israelites fled centuries before.

The Holy Family is not preserved from life-threatening difficulties every human family faces. Rather, it is in the midst of difficulty that their holiness is tested, deepened, and revealed as a faithful and obedient response to God.

All the wonderful gifts of grace bestowed on the Holy Family: Jesus' miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit, Joseph's being reassured by the angel in taking the pregnant Mary into his home, the virgin birth, adoration of the Infant by angels, shepherds and three kings, did not preserve this family from hardship.

These simple parents surely had their own fears and challenges: Mary's "How can this be" and Joseph's decision to "divorce her quietly." Yet they responded faithfully and obediently to God's messages. They trusted God's ways. They "rose, took" and God was with them.

Indeed, God is present within the very hardships of our life. Holiness is not absence of difficulties, everyone in life faces hardship at some time or another. What makes Jesus, Mary, and Joseph a holy family is their faithful, obedient response to God's messages. Our families (and the family of the Church) are also holy in our responding faithfully to God's will for us.
