FATHER'S COLUMN

From that time on,
Jesus began to preach and say,
"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee,
he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his
brother Andrew. He said to them,
"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."

This Sunday's Gospel has two parts: Jesus preaches the Good News and calls his first disciples.

The preaching of Jesus and the call to discipleship that he issues, take place in a particular time and setting. Neither is less important.

John has been arrested and the "land is overshadowed by death." It is at this time that Jesus raises his voice to announce: "the kingdom of heaven is at hand," and in this place that he calls his first disciples. Darkness and death do not hinder Jesus' ministry; rather, they are the reason for it. This Gospel context foretells Jesus' destiny as well as our own.

As Jesus begins his public ministry, he gives two simple commands: "repent" and "come after me." As simple as these may sound, they nonetheless embody the radical demands of discipleship. Both demands are made urgent for the same reason: "the kingdom of God is at hand."

The religious expectations of the time was that God's saving work would arise from the holy city Jerusalem and be accomplished by a great and a powerful messiah. Instead, we find an itinerant preacher in Gentile territory inaugurating God's kingdom.

The kingdom of God is not a place, but it is the recognition of God's just and rightful rule over all creation. This is the same saving ministry to which Jesus' disciples were called; it is our own ministry.

To recognize the kingdom in our midst reveals our ongoing need for repentance and invites us to enter ever more fully into the kingdom by following Jesus. The good news is that the light begins to shine here; among the Gentiles, in the darkness. The call of disciples is to be here; in the darkness and under the threat of death. Establishing God's kingdom cannot be thwarted by Jesus' arrest, by dark places, or by political intrigue. However, it can be thwarted by Jesus' very followers who do not repent and take up his saving mission. The way out of a dark and condemned land is to hear the call for repentance. We cannot hear it often enough. For this is the way to living in the light. This is how God's kingdom is established: faithful disciples hear Jesus' call; they repent and they faithfully follow him. In this way, gloom and darkness are overcome.
