FATHER'S COLUMN

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him.

He began to teach them, saying:
"Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven..."

Who does not want to be blessed?

Being blessed evokes images of peace, prosperity, perfection. For Jesus, being blessed is more than here and now, visible and tangible happiness. Being blessed comes from the joy of being of him, in him, and with him, now and forever.

Jesus began to teach the Beatitudes to his disciples. He is saying that discipleship must be rooted in his own blessedness, shaped by it, and arise also from his own blessedness. His blessedness is marked by giving of self, emptying of self, letting go of self. Jesus teaches us that being blessed is being of him, in him, and with him. We arrive at the promise of the Beatitudes ("for they will"), after a lifetime of faithful discipleship.

Who does not want to be blessed? All those who choose to be greedy, proud, unjust, insensitive, self-righteous, self-promoting, egotistical, sowers of discord, persecutors, maligners, dishonest.

Who is blessed? Jesus has told us. To be blessed, one has to be, to do, and to live as Jesus himself.

A LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has given Catholics in the United States an opportunity to share faith in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout Latin America and the Caribbean islands.

The year 2025 marked the 60th anniversary of the promulgation of Dei Verbum, the document on Divine Revelation issued during the Second Vatican Council. In that document, the Council Fathers call for all the Christian faithful to have "easy access to Sacred Scripture" so that they might more deeply know and love God through understanding and meditating on the Scriptures (no. 22).

To commemorate this important anniversary and help the bishops fulfill their mission to proclaim the Word of God to all people, the Catholic Biblical Federation used funds received through the Collection for the Church in Latin America to gather 130 participants for a Bible conference at the Mexico City headquarters of the Conferencia del Episcopado Mexicano in April 2025. There biblical pastoral ministry leaders from countries throughout Latin America came together for formation in the teachings of Dei Verbum and for the opportunity to collaborate with and encourage one another in this critical pastoral ministry.

Your support for the Collection for the Church in Latin America helps church leaders throughout Central and South America and the Caribbean to fulfill their mission to preach the Word of God and to awaken a love of Scripture in the hearts of those they serve.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of Jan 31/Feb 1, 2026. Please be generous toward this collection. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish's online giving platform. Bookkeeper/Secretary Needed

Our parish unit is in need of new bookkeepers and secretaries at all three parishes as the current staff is ready to step down. We are in need of either one or two persons covering all 3 parishes in our unit or one or two individuals at each parish. The responsibilities of the jobs would be paying bills weekly, completing statistical and Financial Diocesan reports as required, entering weekly contributions, keeping sacramental records up to date and accurate, making ministry schedules, scheduling Mass intentions, preparing 1099 reports at year end, plus other assignments as necessary. The job would probably take about 6-8 hours weekly at each parish or if one person was serving all three parishes 20-25 hours weekly.
